
SMEs need support from all levels to go digital

The challenges and opportunities of digitalisation for SMEs was at the heart of a conference by the European Committee of the Regions in Bucharest on 22 June. The role of local and regional authorities, available EU instruments and synergies for cooperation via interregional programmes have been discussed during the event. Public policy has a key role to play creating the framework conditions for SMEs to enter the digital age. This requires a coordinated approach to tackle the problems SMEs face and to ensure future competitiveness. More information here.



Commission invests €9.2 billion in first ever digital programme

Commission The European proposed to create the first ever Digital Europe programme and invest €9.2 billion to align the next long-term EU budget 2021-2027 with increasing digital challenges. This needs to be matched with equally ambitious funding investments in the Digital Europe programme for increasing EU's international competitiveness as well as developing and reinforcing strategic digital Europe's capacities. Commission renewed initiative 'Stairway to Excellence', to continue to provide tailored support and expertise to regions lagging behind in terms of innovation. The initiative will help regions develop, update and refine their smart specialisation strategies. On the 25th of June at the Digital Assembly in Sofia, Bulgaria, the European Commission is launching Digital Agenda for the Western Balkans. This aims to support the transition of the region into a digital economy and bring the benefits of the digital transformation, such as faster economic growth, more jobs, and better services.
